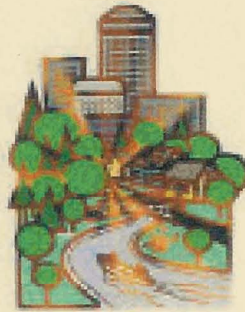
The Urban Forest Council will work with citizens, business owners, non-profit organizations and governmental agencies to enhance community forests in the Spokane region.

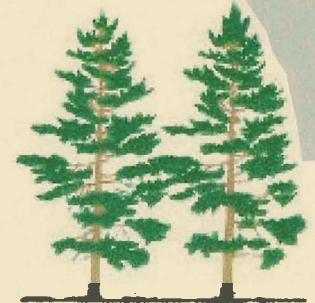
